Dear Parishioners & Visitors,

This Twentieth Sunday presents an opportunity for reflection on the complexities of faith and familial relationships as illustrated in the Gospel reading from Luke 12:49-53. Jesus said to his disciples: 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already! When I was going through the gospel reading, a phrase kept coming back to me very spontaneously. It was the first line of a poem-prayer, written by a famous British sailor of the 16th Century, Sir Francis Drake: **Disturb us, Lord, when...** In a similar vein, our own prayer and reflection this Sunday is simply to allow Jesus to disturb us.

In the gospel passage, Jesus articulates a stark message about his mission: he has come to bring not peace but division. This provocative statement reverberates through the ages, prompting believers to grapple with its implications within their lives and communities. The division, however, is not a call to discord for its own sake but rather a challenge to prioritize one's commitment to the truth of the Gospel above all else. This prioritization often requires difficult choices, as allegiance to the Gospel can create tension within personal relationships when beliefs and values diverge. This was the case of Jeremiah in the First reading who was persecuted because he was a lonely voice that was putting pressure on King Zedekiah to surrender to reduce the suffering of the people when the city of Jerusalem was besieged by Nebuchadnezzar.

In embracing this challenge of sometimes being a lonely voice, believers are called to a deeper understanding of what it means to follow Christ, even when it leads to moments of discomfort or sacrifice within their closest circles. This journey of discipleship invites us to reflect on the prophetic mission of Jesus, which echoes the ancient prophecy from Micah, calling us to act justly and love mercy even when it sets us apart from those we hold dear. The passage also encourages us to consider how the call to discipleship may compel us to confront and transform societal norms that conflict with Gospel values, urging a commitment that transcends comfort and familiarity. This commitment is an invitation to live out our faith with courage and authenticity, even when it requires us to swim against the current of popular opinion or entrenched societal structures.

Steadfast dedication to the Gospel not only reshapes personal lives but also revitalizes our communities, as we strive to embody the Kingdom of God through acts of justice, mercy, and love. As we navigate this path, we are reminded of the profound truth that our ultimate allegiance to Christ may sometimes lead us to places of solitude. Such moments of solitude, however, are not devoid of purpose; they serve as sacred opportunities for introspection and growth, allowing us to draw nearer to God and align our lives more closely with His will. In these moments of solitude, we find the strength to embrace our role as peacemakers and reconcilers, embodying a love that transcends human divisions and reflects the boundless mercy of God.




THE FEAST OF THE QUEENSHIP OF THE **BLESSED VIRGIN MARY** is a relatively recent addition to the Catholic calendar, established in 1954 by Pope Pius XII. This feast is closely linked to the Assumption (15th August), a prelude to her coronation as Queen of all creation.

Mary's royal title isn't mere flattery. It is rooted in ancient Hebrew tradition where the mother of the king held a position of unique honour and influence, as exemplified in 1 Kings 2:19 when King Solomon honours his mother Bathsheba by placing her on a throne at his right hand. 


