Dear Parishioners & Visitors,

This Twenty-second Sunday focuses on humility as a virtue for God's kingdom, drawing from the readings: Sirach's advice to be humble to find favour with God, Hebrews' reminder of the spiritual community of saints and angels, and Jesus' gospel teaching about seeking the lowest place at a banquet to be exalted by God. The core message encourages selfless service, openness to God's Word, and the recognition that true greatness lies in humility and self-effacing service, not in seeking worldly status.

Meals played an important role in the society in which Jesus lived. More than a time for sharing nourishment, they were a time to share ideas and to model different aspects of social relationships. In Luke's Gospel, the places that a person ate (at the home of a tax collector, 5:29), the people with whom a person ate (sinners, 5:30), whether a person washed before eating (11:38), and, as is the case here, the place that a person sits while eating are all important. The narrator says Jesus tells a parable, but it is a wise advice to both guests and hosts about finding true happiness at the heavenly banquet.

To feel honoured and distinguished is one hidden desire that is inherent in many of us! This desire is noble and divine since God made it clear in 1 Sam 2:30 that "those who honour me I will honour and those who dishonour me I will dishonour." Every honour and honourable state come from God. One of the greatest problems we face is the path through which we seek honour from God or even from people! Most often we walk the path of pride! This is an arrogant and pugnacious attitude of feeling more relevant and important than others; the deceptive disposition of pricing oneself above others. The First Reading (Ecclesiasticus 3:19-21,30-31) makes it clear to us "There is no cure for the proud man's malady, since an evil growth has taken root in him." The shortest path to dishonour is the path of pride. Many have walked this path and they remain eternal lessons to all of us.

We are invited this day to reject the path of pride if we want to be truly honoured! The Path of humility remains the most excellent and efficient way to receive honour both from God and from men and women! Because "The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly, and then you will find favour with the Lord; for great though the power of the Lord is, He accepts the homage of the humble." Also, "everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted." The world today may want to convince us that the true and noble path of humility is the path of weakness. But then history has proved that the path of pride is the path of destruction. Also, those who walked this wrong path were forgotten whereas those who walked the true path of humility are always remembered and are given to us as examples; as we have in the saints.

The readings today emphasize that true spiritual "greatness" is found in humbling oneself and serving others, not in seeking worldly honour or status.


